What is an ORCID iD?

It's a unique 16-digit number that links your research to you specifically, distinguishing you from researchers who have a similar or even the same name as you.

Why establish an ORCID iD?

- An ORCID iD will always link you to your work.
- Distinguish yourself.
- Federal grants now require a digital persistent identifier (DPI), like an ORCID iD.



Why establish an ORCID iD?

It will save you time and administrative drudgery...

- by linking your ORCID record to other platforms,
- by populating Elements, and
- by auto-populating many publication submission and grant application forms.

61 publishers require ORCID IDs before submission, including:



Set Your ORCID Record to Update Automatically

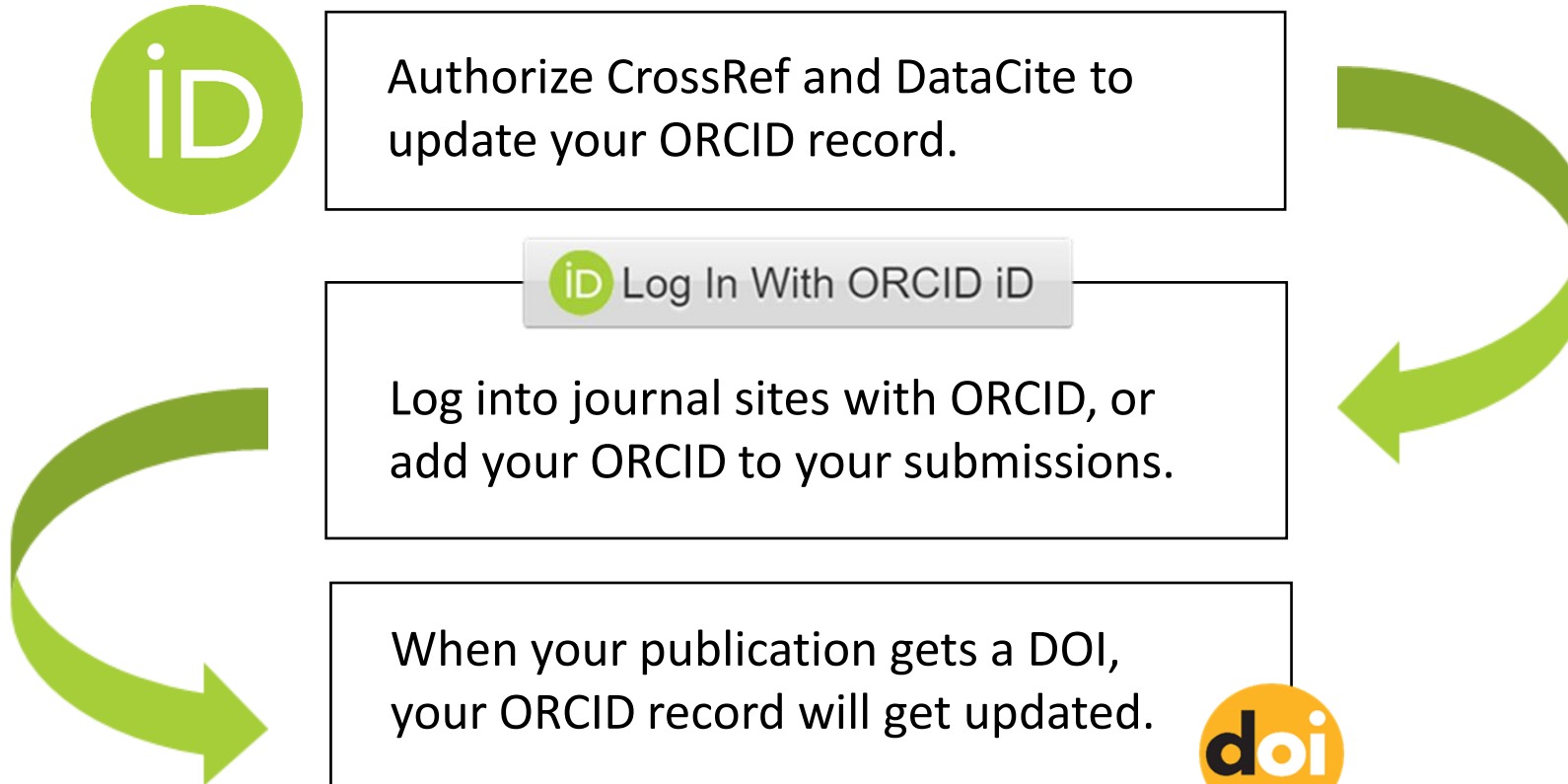


Authorize CrossRef and DataCite to update your ORCID record.

 Log In With ORCID iD

Log into journal sites with ORCID, or add your ORCID to your submissions.

When your publication gets a DOI, your ORCID record will get updated.
