BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

James S. Zacharie was a prominent New Orleans writer and first president of the Louisiana State Museum Board of Curators.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Diary entries describe Zacharie's observations and impressions of France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany, as he travelled through these countries in 1863-1864. He notes the living conditions of Jews in Amsterdam, Holland, and Frankfort, Germany, and the marriage customs of Germans in Brunswick. Zacharie's interests in horse racing, art museums, European royalty, and the theater are also reflected in the diary.

Horse racing--Europe.	1863	Race horse owned by [Alfred] Montgomery of New Orleans wins 10,000 francs in Chantilly, France, Sept. 20; Steeplechase in Spa, Belgium, attended by Zacharie and the Henderson family of New Orleans, Sept. 21-22
Jews--Germany--Frankfort-- Social conditions.	1863	Zacharie visits Judenstrasse, or "Jews' Street" in Frankfort, "a reunion of old broken down houses, full of filth both human and material," Oct. 7
Jews--Netherlands-- Amsterdam--Social conditions.	1863	Zacharie comments on the numerous Jews in Amsterdam, their occupations, and wretched living conditions, Oct. 2;
Marriage customs and rites-- Germany.	1864	Description of wedding ceremony and celebration, June 9-10
