BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Minns Sledge (M.S.) Robertson was born on May 8, 1890, in Alabama. He married Valley Eulalia Goree (1889-1957), with whom he had two daughters, Marjorie Robertson (1918-1973) and Gwendolyn Robertson (1924-1998). Robertson studied and worked in the education field throughout his life. From the late 1930s to the early 1940s, Robertson held the position of State Supervisor of the Education Program at the Louisiana division of the Works Progress Administration. In the mid-1940s Robertson worked as a field representative in the Division of Surplus Property Utilization for the U.S. Office of Education. From the late 1940s to the mid-1950s, Robertson was employed as a Research Professor of Education in the Louisiana State University College of Education, where he also served as an associate director of the Bureau of Educational Materials and Research. He was the author of *Public Education in Louisiana after 1898*, published in 1952 by the Bureau of Educational Materials and Research at the LSU College of Education. Robertson died in April 1968 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana at the age of 77.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Minns S. Robertson Papers contain the professional papers of M.S. Robertson, which include professional correspondence, organizational records, printed materials, and research files. Most of the papers are organizational records from LSU and the College of Education, the National Education Association, the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the United States Office of Education, the Works Progress Administration, and other organizations, primarily related to education. Also included in these papers are printed materials such as journal publications, published articles, standardized test materials, newspaper clippings, printed promotional materials from various organizations, and Robertson's research files and notes.

SERIES AND SUBSERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Series I. Correspondence, 1940-1956

This series contains correspondence collected by Robertson from 1940 to 1956. The personal correspondence in this series (box 1, folders 1-8) includes correspondence between Robertson and his professional colleagues. The remainder of this series (box 1, folders 9-17) includes requests for publication copies (box 1, folders 10-12), letters of commendation for Robertson's *Public Education in Louisiana after 1898* (box 1, folder 13), receipts and invoices (box 1, folder 14), and other various correspondence.

Series II. Organizational Records, 1929-1968, undated

This series contains organizational records collected by Robertson from 1929 to 1968. This series is divided into six subseries. Most records are from LSU, specifically the College of Education (Subseries 1), the National Education Association (Subseries 2), the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools (Subseries 3), the United States Office of Education (Subseries 4), and the Works Progress Administration (Subseries 5). This series also contains materials and records from other assorted organizations, primarily related to education (Subseries 6). Subseries 1-5 are arranged chronologically. Subseries 6 is arranged alphabetically by the name of the organization.

Subseries 1. Louisiana State University, 1938-1968, undated

This subseries contains records from LSU, specifically the College of Education, collected by Robertson from 1938 to 1968. Included are assorted departmental records, such as memoranda to faculty and staff, faculty meeting minutes, course materials and records, departmental receipts, and other materials. Records from LSU that are not related to the College of Education (box 1, folders 18-37) are housed together and arranged chronologically from 1941 to 1955. Records from the College of Education (box 1, folders 38-67 and box 2, folders 1-35) are housed together and arranged chronologically from 1938 to 1968.

Subseries 2. National Education Association, 1932-1955, undated

This subseries contains records from the National Education Association (NEA) collected by Robertson from 1932 to 1954. Included are records from various departments and associations within the NEA, such as the Department of Adult Education (box 2, folders 37-43), the American Association of School Administrators (box 2, folders 46-49), the National Commission on Teacher Education and Professional Standards (box 2, folders 51-52), the American Educational Research Association (box 2, folders 59-62), and others. Also included are newsletters and bulletins, membership information, and annual conference materials. This subseries is arranged chronologically.

Subseries 3. Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, 1952-1955

This subseries contains records from the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools (SACSS) collected by Robertson from 1952 to 1955. Included are materials from the SACSS Commission on Research and Service (box 2, folders 66-70) and annual conference information (box 2, folders 71-76). Also included are financial/budgetary records (box 2, folder 64), correspondence (box 2, folder 78), and newsletters (box 2, folder 79). This subseries is arranged chronologically.

Subseries 4. U.S. Office of Education, 1941-1955, undated

This subseries contains records from the U.S. Office of Education collected by Robertson from 1941 to 1955. This subseries consists primarily of correspondence (box 3, folders 5-18), Division of Surplus Property Utilization records (box 3, folders 25-27), travel documents and vouchers (box 3, folders 29-34), War Assets Administration records (box 3, folders 35-38), and Department of Health, Education, and Welfare records (box 3, folders 43-45). This subseries is arranged chronologically.

Subseries 5. Works Progress Administration, 1936-1942, undated

This subseries contains records from the Works Progress Administration (WPA). Included in this subseries are materials from various divisions and programs within the WPA's Education Program of Louisiana, such as the Family Life Education Section (box 4, folders 8-13), the Adult Education Project (box 4, folders 15-19), the Citizenship Program (box 4, folders 24-28) and others. This subseries is arranged chronologically.

Subseries 6. Other Organizations, 1929-1955, undated

This subseries contains records from other organizations and associations collected by Robertson from 1929 to 1955 that were not included in the previous five subseries. The organizations and associations included in this subseries are primarily related to education, such as the Louisiana School Board Association (box 5, folders 4-7), the Louisiana State Department of Education (box 5, folders 13-31), the Louisiana Teachers Association (box 5, folders 33-39) and others. This subseries is arranged alphabetically by the name of the organization.

Series III. Printed Materials, 1931-1954, undated

This series contains printed materials collected by Robertson from 1931 to 1954, most of which are related to education. Included are journal publications, published articles, standardized test materials, newspaper clippings, and printed promotional materials from various organizations or brands. This series is arranged chronologically.

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Series IV. Research Files and Notes, 1910-1955, undated

This series contains research files and notes created and compiled by Robertson from 1910 to 1955. Included in this series are Robertson's notes used during the writing of his book *Public Education in Louisiana after 1898* (box 5, folder 86), speeches and addresses given at various public schools in Louisiana, (box 5, folder 80), notes and statistics regarding African American education in Louisiana (box 5, folders 79, 82, and 88), and other research files and notes. This series is arranged chronologically.
