BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Robert Warren Heck was born October 14, 1924, in Council Bluffs, Iowa. Heck was a professor at the Louisiana State University School of Architecture from 1955 to 1988, serving as Acting Head from 1974 to 1975, as well as Acting Director from 1980 to 1981 and 1986 to 1987. Additionally, Heck served as president of the Foundation for Historical Louisiana and as president of the Old State Capitol Associates. He also served on the Historic Marker Committee of Baton Rouge. Heck co-authored, with Otis B. Wheeler, *Religious Architecture in Louisiana* (Louisiana State University Press, 1995). In 1995, Heck was awarded the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture Distinguished Professor Award. Heck died June 5, 1997, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, at age 72.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Robert W. Heck Papers primarily contain research files and notes compiled by Heck, which are related to architecture and historical buildings, especially religious architecture in Louisiana used in writing *Religious Architecture in Louisiana*. Also included in the Robert W. Heck Papers are Heck's professional correspondence, materials and records related to the Community Renewal Program of Baton Rouge, published materials collected by Heck, maps, and blueprints.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Series I. Correspondence, 1961-1988

This series contains professional correspondence from 1961 to 1988. This series is arranged chronologically.

Series II. Community Renewal Program of Baton Rouge, 1968-1971

This series contains materials and records related to the Community Renewal Program (CRP) of Baton Rouge from 1968 to 1971. The CRP was initiated in 1968 with the purpose of assessing the physical, social, and economic conditions of Baton Rouge. The CRP collected and analyzed data from various areas of Baton Rouge, such as growth patterns, population characteristics, land use, and housing. Heck served as a historical consultant for the CRP. Included in this series is correspondence (box 1, folder 5), general information (box 1, folder 6), historical surveys conducted on various buildings and neighborhoods of Baton Rouge (box 1, folders 7-25), and a final report of the program's findings (box 1, folder 26). This series is arranged chronologically.

Series III. Research Files and Notes, 1938-1992, undated

This series contains research files and notes from 1938 to 1992. Included in this series are two subseries containing research files and notes used by Heck in writing *Religious Architecture in Louisiana* and other research files and notes pertaining to Heck's work. Each subseries is arranged alphabetically.

Subseries 1. *Religious Architecture in Louisiana* Research Files and Notes, circa 1989-1991

This subseries contains research files and notes used by Heck in writing *Religious Architecture in Louisiana*. Included in this subseries are records pertaining to various churches and other religious buildings in Louisiana. These records include original research and notes by Heck, as well as original photographs by Otis B. Wheeler. This subseries is arranged alphabetically by Parish name.

Subseries 2. Other Research Files and Notes, 1938-1992, undated

This subseries contains assorted research files and notes used by Heck in his work. Included in this subseries are research files and notes related to the architecture and history of Baton Rouge (box 3, folders 21-40), New Orleans (box 5 folders 50-52 and box 6, folders 1-16), as well as other cities and states. This subseries also includes research files and notes related to various Louisiana plantations, such as Magnolia Mound Plantation (box 5, folders 23-29), Whitney Plantation (box 6, folder 62), Oakley Plantation (box 6, folders 19-20), and others. Also included in this subseries are research

files and notes related to various historical buildings and landmarks in Louisiana, such as Los Adaes State Historic Site (box 5, folders 10-11), the Baton Rouge Pentagon Barracks (box 6, folders 25-27), Port Hudson (box 6, folder 31), and others. This subseries is arranged alphabetically.

Series IV. Published Materials, 1921-1997, undated

This series contains published materials from 1921 to 1997. Included in this series are issues from publications related to architecture, such as *Journal of Architectural Education* (box 7, folders 8 and 13, box 8, folder 11), *Historic Preservation* (box 7, folder 12), *Alabama Architect* (box 7, folder 23), and others. This series also contains programs from various exhibitions related to architecture (box 7, folders 7 and 10, box 8, folders 5 and 16). Also included in this series are issues of assorted newspapers, such as *The Delta Gazette*, *The Asphodel Enterprise*, *Preservation News*, *Preservation in Print*, as well as supplements to *Sunday Advocate*, *West Side Journal*, and *St. Francisville Democrat* (box 9). This series is arranged chronologically, although the newspapers are housed separately for preservation purposes.

Series V. Maps and Blueprints, 1963-1995, undated

This series contains maps and blueprints from 1963 to 1995. Included in this series are maps of various parishes in Louisiana, such as West Feliciana Parish, Claiborne Parish, and Lincoln Parish. This series also contains maps of various cities in Louisiana, such as Clinton, Homer, Lake Claiborne, Vidalia, Zachary, and others. Also included in this series are blueprints, guides for historical building tours, and a hand-drawn map of Magnolia Mound Plantation. This series is arranged chronologically.
